STATEMENTS

STATEMENT RESPONSE ON-KWA LUMA AND KWA KYULE EARTH DAMS

Hon. Temporary Speaker (Julius Mwalali): Hon. Members I call upon the Chairperson Committee on Water and Irrigation Services to respond to a Statement which was requested by the Member for Nguu/Masumba Ward regarding Kwa Luma and Kwa Kyule Earth Dams.

Hon. Member for Mbooni Ward (Joseph Musya): Mr. Speaker sir, I hereby rise to give a response to the Statement requested on Wednesday, 4th March, 2015, by Hon. Timothy Maneno, MCA, Nguu/Masumba Ward, regarding Kwa Luma and Kwa Kyule Earth Dams.

Mr. Speaker sir, during the financial year 2013/2014, these dams were excavated by the National Government through TARDA.

Mr. Speaker sir, the Honorable Member had requested clarification on:-

(Hon. Member's phone rang)

I am sorry for the interruption.

- a) What was the total amount of money that was allocated for the excavation of the two dams?

- b) Why was the work done shoddily and not to the expectation of the residents?
- c) Why didn't TARDA involve residents and stakeholders in the implementation of the projects?
- d) Have the contractors been fully paid? If so, how will the residents get their right of getting perfectly constructed earth dams which are expected to solve the water problem in the area?

Hon. Temporary Speaker (Julius Mwalali): The Hon. Member you are not being properly captured by the HANSARD. --- *(Instructs the Sergeant at Arms)* You can serve him with the wireless microphone.

(Hon. Member resumed reading)

- e) If the County Government of Makueni has an employee of the National Government who was seconded to oversee such projects in the County and why hasn't such officer intervened?
- f) Why did the contractors fence only one side of Kwa Luma Earth Dam leaving the other section of the dam undone?
- g) What volume of water are the two dams expected to hold as per the agreement documents between the sponsor and the contractor?
- h) Why do the two dams vary in size and general work plan if they were allocated equal amounts of money?

Mr. Speaker sir, the County Executive Committee Member for Water, Irrigation and Environment was notified on the above in writing on Friday, 6th March, 2015 through a letter referenced COMM/WI&EN/CA/2015 (02). In the letter, the CEC Member was required to respond on or before Tuesday, 31st March, 2015 at 9.00 a.m.

Mr. Speaker sir, the ECM never responded before the due date. Through a letter dated Thursday, 19th March, 2015 (REF: COMM/WI&EN/CA/2015 (03)), the Committee further invited the ECM to a consultative meeting that was scheduled on Tuesday, 24th March, 2015 at 11:00 a.m. to respond to the pending Statements. The ECM never showed up and he has not responded to the matter even up to date.

Mr. Speaker sir, I hereby request for more time to respond to the Statement. I would wish to be given up to Thursday, 23rd April, 2015 at 2.30 p.m. Mr. Speaker sir, attached to this Statement are the letters that the Committee had written to the County Executive Committee Member for Water, Irrigation and Environment. Thank you, Mr. Speaker sir.

Hon. Temporary Speaker (Julius Mwalali): Thank you Hon. Member. It is quite unfortunate that the Hon. Members do not have the copies to refer to the letters quoted and now that the Hon. Member has requested for more time I call upon the Member who requested for the Statement to react on the same. I call upon the Member for Nguu/Masumba.

Hon. Deputy Minority Leader (Timothy Maneno): Thank you Mr. Speaker -- - *(Inaudible)* I will accept that if awarding more time will give a response that will satisfy what I have requested in my Statement I have no problem. If this will come on 23rd April, 2015 I would request the Chairman Water and Irrigation Services to ensure that by this time he pesters the respective ECM Member so that this particular information is then given on the 23rd April, 2015 without fail. I beg to accept the extension of time, thank you.

Hon. Temporary Speaker (Julius Mwalali): Hon. Musya.

Hon. Member for Mbooni Ward (Joseph Musya): Thank you. Mr. Speaker sir I would like the House to note that the same ECM Member has not been responding to such letters even in the Department of Health. I regret to say this kind of highest degree of arrogance being displayed by the Executive Member should cease because I will not promise the Member for Nguu Ward that on the same date the same ECM Member will have responded but if he will have responded well and good and if not then the Committee will take the legal measures as stipulated by the Standing Orders. Thank you and I am much obliged.

Hon. Temporary Speaker (Julius Mwalali): I call upon Hon. Member for Emali/Mulala.

Hon. Member for Emali/Mulala (Cosmas Kaleli): --- *(Inaudible) (Technical Hitch)*

Hon. Temporary Speaker (Julius Mwalali) The Hon. Member for Masongaleni, who also the Chair Health Committee.

Hon. Member for Masongaleni Ward (John Kilonzo): Thank you Mr. Speaker. I have not cry about the woes affecting my Health docket but my concern is this. We have two arms of the Government making one County Government and our role being oversight, the implementation part is undertaken by the Executive. None of the two Arms can work effectively without the other. So I feel - because the Statement we have here is part of oversight -unless we are given the answer to that, it means that we are carrying problems for other Departments or rather the other

arm of the Government. We may talk a lot here and maybe ask questions to the Chairman who is supposed to answer that Statement yet there is somebody who is supposed to give that response. Unless we come up with a clear cut demarcation on what we are supposed to do, I think we are going to become a laughing stock. We may be termed as obese Members who just come here to eat and sleep because if we are not delivering on our part, I think we are doing a lot of undoing to ourselves. It is high time a Motion is brought to this House, requiring the ECMs to come and respond to those Statements directly from the floor of the House because I feel perturbed when I am supposed to bring a well comprehended Statement but instead I come here and start crying that there is no response. I think there is much to be done than what we have seen. Thank you Mr. Speaker.

(Hon. Timothy Maneno stands on a Point of Information).

Hon. Temporary Speaker (Julius Mwalali): Yes information Hon. Member and then we get to Hon. Kavita.

Hon. Deputy Minority Leader (Timothy Maneno): Mr. Speaker I just wanted to give information that should go on record. As much as we will be giving Statements which as you know is only one vent where these Members would register their cases may be on projects that are not done well and let me say or inform the Members that even if we allow them visit these particular projects, what they will be doing is confirming or attesting whether what has been requested is what is on the ground. I think I was very mild when I was accepting the extension of this period. If we look at the particular requests that have been registered as Statements from the two dockets which the ECM Member is handling; Water and Irrigation and also in Health I would not even care whether it is answered but I think of whatever consequences that one will be given. Mr. Speaker I don't know whether we are together?

Hon. Temporary Speaker (Julius Mwalali): Proceed.

Hon. Deputy Minority Leader (Timothy Maneno): Mr. Speaker I wanted to request Members that because we have requested for many Statements-and particularly from these two dockets - not look at the consequences the ECM will get. The writing is on the wall. I will not look to the political divide in this Assembly while putting this one across. Let us accept that as a Member Nguu/ Masumba who had requested for this Statement, I want to accept that we take this extension, time given will elapse and definitely if this will not come, I will be leading what should be done next. I did not want to react much, I just wanted to state it that way. Let us

just let it go but I am sure it will have created bulk work on him and I am telling you if the Chairman Water and Irrigation will have not given this one on 23rd April, then I will have no choice and that is why I was saying I will not care about the next consequences that will be given to anybody including the ECM. Thank you.

Hon. Temporary Speaker (Julius Mwalali): The Hon. Member Muvau.

Hon. Member for Kikumini/ Muvau Ward (Josiah Kavita): Thank you Mr. Speaker. I want to agree with my brother Hon. Emali/ Mulala Ward that the situation we are in is getting out of hand but it is only in this same House that the ECM involved in this matter was rated the best in terms of performance. I do not stand up for the Government but I agree that he is a performer. However, I have one concern that we have Leader Majority here, who responds on the behalf of the Government yet there is a rumor that the ECM in charge of Water and acting in Health has been away. I think the Majority Leader should tell this House or give House the position of where the ECM is and if when he returns he will be capable to answer these questions. Thank you Mr. Speaker.

(Hon. Member for Emali/ Mulala interjected)

Hon. Temporary Speaker (Julius Mwalali): Hon. Member for Emali/ Mulala permission is not granted. I wanted to allow the Hon. Member for Kitundu Ward to contribute.

Hon. Member for Kithungo Ward (Christant Keli): I would not want as my Hon. Brother Kavita said, *'to engage in rumors'* because he is actually saying there rumors but we also need to find out what is actually happening in the docket of Water because there are so many Statements that have gone unanswered. Mr. Speaker I would also want to know what is happening in the Committee and especially the Chairperson because he seems not to have the right chemistry to produce results in this House. While we are looking at the issue with the ECM, we might also want to look at the issue within the Committee and the Committee is in the best position to advise us what is really happening because it is not ordinary that so many Statements can go unanswered unless there is something terribly wrong somewhere. We actually need to dig further and find out what is actually happening because for sure without engaging in rumors there is something happening in the Assembly that is represented by the Committee on Water and the Executive represented by the ECM.

So, as we wait because Hon. Maneno has agreed to wait I think it is upon us and try to see what his happening and as that Report comes, we also inform ourselves. I

think if Committee are not effective and if they cannot produce results, we should actually find out what the problem is and they should actually table a Report here and tell us their problem so that we can handle the problem as a House. This is where I connect with Mheshimiwa Kavita, the Leader Majority and the Leader Minority being the Assembly Leaders they might also need to assist us in finding out what is happening because I think this is the third or fourth Statement that has gone unanswered or that has been delayed. You also remember previously we had other problems in the same docket especially on the issue of Kasikeu Health Centre. That is my take on this issue. I am not running away from responsibility, I will also be trying to find out what is happening. Thank you.

Hon. Member for Mbooni Ward (Joseph Musya): --- *(Inaudible)*.

Hon. Temporary Speaker (Julius Mwalali): The Hon. Member who responded to the Statement what is it?

Hon. Member for Mbooni Ward (Joseph Musya): Mr. Speaker I would like to comment on what Mheshimiwa Keli has said because this is affecting my Committee giving negative aspersions on my Chairman. I wanted to ask whether---

Hon. Temporary Speaker (Julius Mwalali): Order Hon. Musya! Maybe as you comment let us get the information from the Member for Emali and comment on all. Hon. Member for Emali can you give the information.

Hon. Member for Emali/ Mulala Ward (Cosmas Mutunga): --- *(Inaudible)* *(Technical hitch)*.

Hon. Temporary Speaker (Julius Mwalali): Okay Hon. Member you can now comment ----

(Hon. Martin Mutuku stands on a Point of Order)

Hon. Member for Mbooni Ward (Joseph Musya): Thank you Mr. Speaker.

Hon. Temporary Speaker (Julius Mwalali): Order Hon. Member for Mavindini! Can you—

Hon. Member for Mavindini Ward (Martin Mutuku): Point of Order No. 15.

Hon. Temporary Speaker (Julius Mwalali): Point of order? I allow the Point of Order. Which number?

Hon. Member for Mavindini Ward (Martin Mutuku): No. 15.

Hon. Temporary Speaker (Julius Mwalali): 15.

Hon. Member for Mavindini Ward (Martin Mutuku): Thank you Mr. Speaker. I want to say that the Hon. Member; Hon. Kavita raised an issue on the Majority Leader and I want to read. In this House looking at Standing Order No. 15, the Leader of Majority in this House is supposed to respond to the issues which are affecting this Assembly pertains --- (*Inaudible*) and I raised the same last week. The Speaker communicated to us that the Leader Majority is supposed to be conversant when responding to issues of the Government. I think the Majority Leader of this Assembly can also be responsible when responding--

Hon. Temporary Speaker (Julius Mwalali): Hon. Member can you read that to the Hon. Members.

Hon. Member for Mavindini Ward (Martin Mutuku): I am going to read this, 15 (1) *The largest party or coalition of parties in the County Assembly shall elect a Member of the County Assembly belonging to the party or coalition of parties to be the Leader of the Majority Party.*

(Hon. Christant Keli stands on a Point of Order)

Hon. Temporary Speaker (Julius Mwalali): He is on a Point of Order Hon. Member can you hold.

Hon. Member for Mavindini Ward (Martin Mutuku): Mr. Speaker I am raising this very strongly because last week I rose and said that issues of the Government should be responded to by the Hon. Minority Leader but the Speaker said, the Majority Leader of this Assembly is also supposed to respond to any issues pertaining the Executive. I think the Hon. Kavita was in order when he was requiring the Majority to respond --- (*Inaudible*) in this House. I think I am in Order.

Hon. Temporary Speaker (Julius Mwalali): Order Hon. Member. Is that related to what the Hon. Member had stated? Hon. Member you are irrelevant and you are out of Order. Let us proceed Hon. Musya.

Hon. Member for Mbooni Ward (Joseph Musya): Thank you Mr. Speaker and thank you for controlling wayward Members in the Assembly. When you read between lines after--

(Hon. Martin Mutuku stands on a Point of Order)

Hon. Temporary Speaker (Julius Mwalali): Hon. Member maintain order in the House! Proceed Hon. Musya. Hon. Martin Mutuku can you take your seat.

Hon. Member for Mavindini Ward (Martin Mutuku): Mr. Speaker is it in Order that I am abused by the Hon. Member?

Hon. Temporary Speaker (Julius Mwalali): Let the Hon. Member withdraw then proceed. Take your seat.

Hon. Member for Mbooni Ward (Joseph Musya): Mr. Speaker sir, I think is the question of semantics. If one cannot understand an English word they better say so, so that it can be defined further. Wayward means you are going astray from the right direction.

(Applause)

Hon. Temporary Speaker (Julius Mwalali): Proceed Hon. Musya.

(Hon. Member interjected)

Hon. Temporary Speaker (Julius Mwalali): Over ruled Hon. Member. Let the Member comment---

Hon. Member for Mbooni Ward (Joseph Musya): Mr. Speaker thank you for protecting me from other disruption by wayward Members.

(Laughter)

Hon. Member for Mbooni Ward (Joseph Musya): When you read between lines you find that there is---

(Hon. Christant Keli stands on a Point of Information)

Hon. Temporary Speaker (Julius Mwalali): What is the information Hon. Member?

Hon. Member for Kithungo/ Kitundu Ward (Christant Keli): Mr. Musya---

Hon. Temporary Speaker (Julius Mwalali): Hon. Member there is no Mr. in this House.

(Laughter)

Hon. Member for Kithungo/ Kitundu Ward (Christant Keli): --- *(Technical hitch)*

Hon. Member for Mbooni Ward (Joseph Musya): Mr. Speaker sir---

Hon. Temporary Speaker (Julius Mwalali): Hon. Member can you use simpler language as you contribute?

Hon. Member for Mbooni Ward (Joseph Musya): I am very happy that the Hon. Keli appreciates that I was a teacher and I would like my Hon. Students to be attentive when ---

(Laughter)

Hon. Member for Mbooni Ward (Joseph Musya): I still stick to the wayward. I was saying Mr. Speaker sir, when you read between lines from the debating this House on the same issue there is a calculated sabotage for Water, Irrigation Services and Environment Committee from the Executive and I am not surprised Hon. Keli behaves like a KGB mole in this House. He is (???) both in the Executive and Assembly and I am advising him as an elder---

(Laughter)

(Several Members stood on Points of Order)

Hon. Temporary Speaker (Julius Mwalali): Hon. Members you are all on Points of Order. I allow the Hon. Member who is quoting 87 to proceed. Hon. Keli can you take your seat.

Hon. Member for Mavindini Ward (Martin Mutuku): Mr. Speaker I want to read, 87 (1) *A member shall be responsible for the accuracy of any facts which the Member alleges to be true and may be required to substantiate any such facts instantly.* Hon. Musya said that there is sabotage; can he prove to this Assembly which plan he has learnt of and give evidence of the same or withdraw the same. Thank you.

Hon. Member for Mbooni Ward (Joseph Musya): Mr. Speaker ---

(Hon. Christant Keli upstanding)

Hon. Temporary Speaker (Julius Mwalali): Hon. Keli can you take your seat first. Hon. Musya before you proceed, the Hon. Member for Mavindini you need substantiation. Can you categorically inform the Member what you want him to substantiate categorically.

Hon. Member for Mavindini Ward (Martin Mutuku): Thank you Mr. Speaker. I am also happy because I have seen the Clerk close to you and I want him to also go to Standing Order No. 87---

(Hon. Cosmas Mutunga stands on a Point of Order)

Hon. Temporary Speaker (Julius Mwalali): Hon. Member for Emali can you take your seat permission not granted. Hon. Member can you take your seat!

Hon. Member for Mavindini Ward (Martin Mutuku): I am getting worried because most of the Members do not know whether you are the Speaker of this House and this is a House of Order and Procedures. I am referring to 87 which says, 87 (1) *A member shall be responsible for accuracy of any facts...* when the Hon. Member Hon. Musya says there is a plan to make sure this Committee is sabotaged he must give evidence if there is any cartel in this House on the issues of the Committees to be sabotage and---

(Hon. Cosmas Mutunga stands on a Point of Information)

Hon. Member for Mavindini Ward (Martin Mutuku): I am rising on a Point of Order ----

Hon. Temporary Speaker (Julius Mwalali): Order Hon. Members! Let the Hon. Member for Mavindini wind up.

(Hon. Cosmas Mutunga stands on a Point of Information)

Hon. Member for Mavindini Ward (Martin Mutuku): Protect me Mr. Speaker.

Hon. Temporary Speaker (Julius Mwalali): Protected, proceed.

Hon. Member for Mavindini Ward (Martin Mutuku): I want to go further to 87 (2), *If a Member has sufficient reason to convince the Speaker that the Members is unable to substantiate the allegations instantly, the Speaker shall require that such Member substantiate the allegation not later than the next sitting day.* I am rising on Standing Order No. 87 and I need guidance.

Hon. Temporary Speaker (Julius Mwalali): Hon. Member can you allow Hon. Musya to substantiate what you require him to.

Hon. Member for Mavindini Ward (Martin Mutuku): Thank you Mr. Speaker I beg to leave.

Hon. Temporary Speaker (Julius Mwalali): Hon. Keli what is your Point of Order?

Hon. Member for Kithungo/ Kitundu Ward (Christant Keli): --- (*On a Point of Order*). --- (*Technical hitch*) Hon. Musya fails to read between the line. He has no moral authority to actually accuse me of being a KGB mole. It is because of his own oversight or his own shortsightedness that he cannot see that there is a problem. I was just inviting this House to see that there is a problem and he has actually agreed that there is a problem that he says is a move to sabotage the same. We have no business discussing this Report because Hon. Musya asked for more time to which Hon. Maneno agreed. I do not see why this debate is being entertained unless somebody just wants to call people moles. Can he now withdraw or substantiate whether I am a KGB mole.

Hon. Temporary Speaker (Julius Mwalali): Hon. Musya as you proceed do the substantiation and if there is no substantiation you withdraw in few words then we move to the next level of our debates.

(Hon. Cosmas Mutunga stands on a Point of Information)

Hon. Temporary Speaker (Julius Mwalali): Overruled. Proceed Hon. Member.

Hon. Member for Mbooni Ward (Joseph Musya): Thank you Mr. Speaker. I think what we have in this House is a linguistic problem. I said allegedly KGB mole. In the old days of the Cold Wars the spies on each of the side of either the western or the east; the west was the CIA and the Russian was the (KGB). This were spy organizations ---

(Hon. Christant Keli interjects)

Hon. Temporary Speaker (Julius Mwalali): Can you take your seat. Let him substantiate further.

Hon. Member for Mbooni Ward (Joseph Musya): Mr. Speaker sir, thank you for protecting me from the alleged KGB mole in this Assembly.

(Laughter)

Hon. Member for Mbooni Ward (Joseph Musya): I think there is nothing to substantiate when you have an alleged spy in the Assembly and he is at the same time very friendly to the Executive then from----

(Hon. Christant Keli upstanding)

Hon. Temporary Speaker (Julius Mwalali): Order Hon. Keli. I see you want to stand.

Hon. Member for Kithungo/Kitundu Ward (Christant Keli): These are allegations. If he agrees that they are allegations he should actually withdraw or prove the allegations. He has not proved the allegations.

(Loud consultations)

Hon. Temporary Speaker (Julius Mwalali): Hon. Musya can you withdraw then proceed.

Hon. Member for Mbooni Ward (Joseph Musya): Mr. Speaker---

Hon. Temporary Speaker (Julius Mwalali): Withdraw those remarks and proceed.

Hon. Member for Mbooni Ward (Joseph Musya): Mr. Speaker sir I am happy that he has gotten the message. I withdraw. Thank you.

(Applause)

Hon. Temporary Speaker (Julius Mwalali): Hon. Members the next Statement to be responded to is by the Leader Majority. A Statement was brought to this House by the Member for Wote Ward regarding the unpaid wages to casual laborers. The Hon. Leader Majority.

STATEMENT RESPONSE ON - UNPAID WAGES TO CASUAL LABOURERS CONTRACTED BY THE MAKUENI COUNTY GOVERNMENT

Hon. Majority Leader (Francis Mutuku): Thank you Mr. Speaker. I hereby rise to give response to the Statement requested on 18th March, 2015 by Hon. Sammy Maseka Member of County Assembly for Wote/Nziu Ward regarding the casual laborers who were contracted to work for the County Government in the Department of Lands and Urban Planning, Water Irrigation Services & Environment and Health Services for the period between December 2013 and April 2014 to clean various markets of Wote town, Kilala, Nziu, Mumbuni, and Kikumini. The casual laborers worked but they have not been paid their wages accruing to Kshs.133, 465.

The Hon. Member had requested clarification on the following;

1. Whether the office is aware of the casual laborers who were contracted to clean the markets in the mentioned towns and trading centers and have not been paid their dues up to date.
2. The reasons as to why the casual laborers have not been paid their dues up to date despite the numerous claims forwarded to the relevant Departments by their supervisor and;
3. The plans the County Government has put in place to ensure these casual laborers are paid their dues.

The Count Secretary was notified in writing vide letter Ref: ADM/CA/MKN/VOL. 2/ (126) and she has not provided any response on the sought Statement. I hereby therefore- although I can see there is a lot of heat here - request for two weeks from that Hon. Member so that I can give a substantive answer. It is also evident that this week and last week the Members of the Executive have been involved in public participation for the Budget for 2015/2016, and I guess she and most of the Executive Committee Members (ECMs) might have been very busy. I do not want to vilify or crucify anybody at this hour but I want to say may be because they are busy we are rushing against time which is ahead of us, we have to be patient. The law is very clear; if an (ECM) does not respond to a Statement, if an (ECM) does not bring a Report which is required by a Committee the law takes its course. I do not know why we are debating so much an issue which is very clear in our Standing Orders and very clear in the laws of the land that we are practicing. Therefore, I humbly request for those two weeks and we will be able to give a responsible answer because the answer requires that I cannot get it from anywhere else, I have to get it from that particular CS. Thank you.

Hon. Temporary Speaker (Julius Mwalali): the Hon. Member, who had brought the Statement to the House.
